Carolina's Golf Assoc. Membership Approved

Wedgfield Plantation Country Club has been approved for membership in the Carolina's Golf Association.

Wedgfield's P.G.A. Professional, Bobby Ford explained membership in CGA gives Wedgfield members an established handicap and the privilege of playing in golf tournaments sponsored by other CGA member clubs in South and North Carolina.

"Membership in the Carolina Golf Association is an exciting advantage for the avid Wedgfield golfer. Our players can play in sanctioned tournaments anywhere in the Carolinas now", said Ford.

Club members are encouraged to register their handicap scores to be evaluated and re-assigned by C.G.A. Annual membership dues are \$4.00 each and now payable at the pro shop.

Until Carolina's Golf Association can physically rate the course, temporary C.G.A. ratings have been assigned to Wedgfield: back, 74.0; regular, 72.0; and women, 73.0.

Club Hosts Grand Strand Ladies Round Robin Golf

Wedgfield Plantation Country Club will host the 1979 Annual Grand Strand Ladies Round Robin on February first.

The tournament is expected to attract a field of 85 - 100 players, said Golf Professional, Bobby Ford. The 1979 tournament, he explained, will be for high handicap players with established ratings of 27-40. In 1980, ladies with low handicaps from 1-26 will enter round robin play at Wedgfield.

In active play, Brenda Morris and Kathy Harrelson teamed up to take the women's top doubles honors by defeating Bunny Gorman and Beth McAllister.

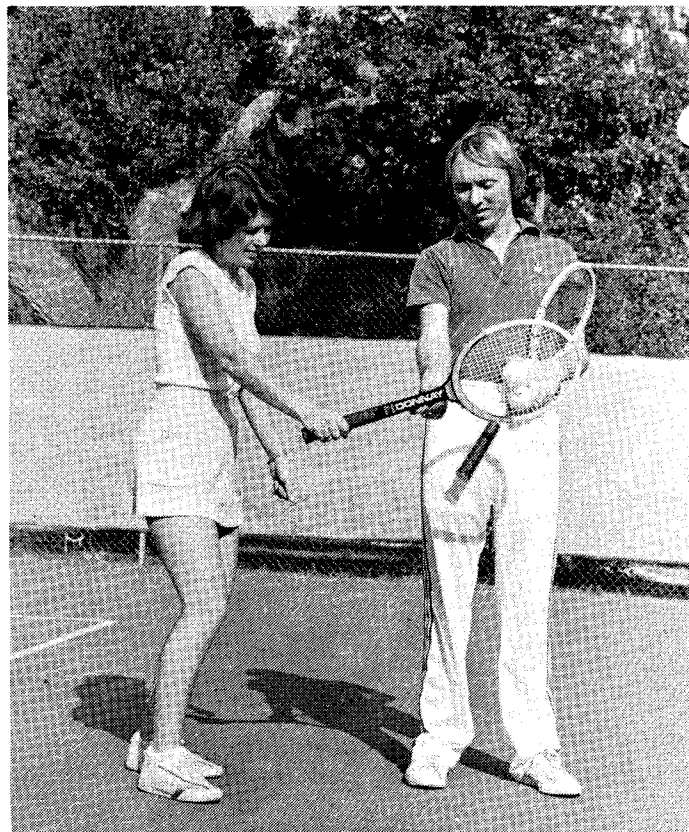
